## Tales from Our Brothers



### A SNIPE TALE

Last year at the April weekend, it rained ... and it rained. I was staying up in the family cabins with the Kitchen Clan. Now, we all know that some strange sightings have occurred at the camp, especially in the dead of night or early before the dawn breaks. It was around 5 a.m., the sun had not decided to rise yet. But those of us in the Kitchen Clan know that an early start is needed to feed our brothers. In two and a half hours the thundering herd would be sitting to eat a hearty breakfast. One that is needed for good days work towards our camp.

I descended the mountain road and was approaching the small rise in the road just before the rangers' house. I thought I had seen something strolling along the road side. Seemed to be headed to the middle of the road. So I stopped the truck and tried to gaze through the wet windshield and the wipers. What in the world was it? Wasn't a mammal, it was a bird strutting his stuff. I didn't want to startle it, but I did want to get down to the kitchen. I knew that Dan would be anxiously waiting for his staff. I thought I'll give him a little more time and then I will blow the horn and chase him.

I waited a brief minute and he kind of stared me down. It wasn't a pheasant or a grouse. What in the world was it? All of a sudden I realized that I had seen him before in pictures. But this was the first time that I actually had seen one.

Now I was inducted into the Order in April 1962 at Camp Nisatin. That made me an Ordeal member of Memeu Lodge 125. I know that Memeu was Lenape for "Woodcock," the lodge totem. I had been told years back by our Lodge Adviser, Jack Hill, that the reason the "woodcock" was chosen for our totem was that there was an abundance of those snipes on the camp property. I have been going to Camp Nisatin since 1958 and I had NEVER actually seen one. This was a first.

I got the impression that he was trying to tell me something. I never chased him. I waited about 10 minutes until he finally fluttered off into the rainy brush. I was excited. I didn't know how to tell anyone what had just happened. Most of the brothers in the Kitchen were previous members of Minsi Lodge. And all they could jokingly say was the Wolves loved to eat BIRDS. Finally I did find some sympathy amongst my Brothers. They were very much interested in the story. The "woodcock" still calls Camp home. The name may have changed, but the land is still the same. A woods for training and growing. A woods for sharing and a woods where learning and seeing new things happens every day.

Thank you for letting me share this story with you. Maybe with a little luck, he will return this coming April.

LEARN MORE: The totem of the former Memeu Lodge, the American Woodcock (*Scolopax minor*), is quite often referred to as a Snipe (the common snipe is typically found closer to the sea shore). The woodcock is found in forests and brushy fields, and is most often seen near dusk. It is distinguished by its large eye set high on its head and erratic flight when startled. They are found only in the Eastern parts of the US and Canada, nest on the ground, and have a diet primarily of earthworms.

## VIGIL PROCESS UPDATE

The Vigil Honor is a mark of distinction and recognition reserved for those Arrow men who, by reasons of exceptional service, personal effort, and unselfish interest, have made distinguished contributions beyond the immediate responsibilities of their position or office to one or more of the following: their lodge, the Order of the Arrow, Scouting or their council Scout Camp. Under no circumstances should tenure in Scouting or the Order of the Arrow be considered as reason enough for a Vigil Honor recommendation.

Stating that, as those of you who attended the last Lodge Executive committee meeting know the youth took a major ground breaking step with the newly adapted National Policy for the choosing of Vigil Honor candidates. In this policy only youth will be voting for the Vigil Honor candidate selection as in all OA matters.

These next selection of paragraphs have been taken word for word out of the National Policy guide book, page 31, paragraphs two, three, and five.

*"The following procedure has been established by the national Order of the Arrow committee to maintain a consistent, high standard in the selection of the Vigil Honor nominees across the nation. Lodges should observe the following procedure in recommending candidates for the Vigil Honor and in carrying out the Vigil Honor induction."*

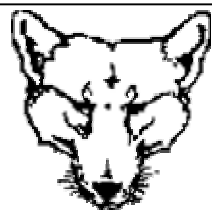
Dear Brothers,

Other than providing medical care the H&S committee also trains and can certify arrowmen in basic first aid and CPR. If you have an interest in helping people or wish to possibly pursue a career in medicine, feel free to stop by the H&S table at your next OA weekend. ## MEMBERSHIP Q&A

**Q: Why do I have to pay dues?**

**A:** Most organizations require some type of annual payment from its members. The Lodge uses the dues payment to pay national OA dues, for awards, training events, committee budgets and general lodge operating expenses. The OA Lodge is a self-sustaining part of the Hawk Mountain Council.

**Q: What is the cost of Lodge dues?**

**A:** Lodge dues are paid based on a on a calendar year January 1 to December 31 and cost \$7.50. Pre-registered members at the September or November weekends are charged \$7.00 since they are picking up their card immediately.

**Q: Can I wear the Lodge flap if my dues are not paid?**

**A:** Members in the OA wear The Lodge flap. If you do not have your dues paid for the current year, then you are not a member. It would be the same thing as a scout wearing an eagle badge who was not an eagle scout.

**Q: Why must I use an ID # on forms?**

**A:** The ID # identifies you uniquely in the lodge database. It also is quicker to enter a 4-digit number when crediting dues, weekend registration, etc.

**Q: Where can I find my ID #?**

**A:** Your unique ID # is printed on your dues card on the line marked 'Lodge No.'. It is also printed on the label of *Herbie Hawk* if you are under 18.

**Q: I want to join Kittatinny 5 and I was a member of another lodge, what do I do?**

**A:** You need to fill out a 'Transfer Form' and provide a letter from your old lodge detailing your OA history. The forms are obtainable at the Scout Office or on the Lodge web site 'Kittatinny5.org'.

**Q: Why must I provide all the information on a reinstatement form?**

**A:** We need the information to research your lodge history. If the information is incomplete, the processing will not proceed until we can either contact you or find the missing information in the archived files. Reinstatement forms are only for former members of Memeu 125, Minsi 5, or Kittatinny 5 Lodges.

**Q: Can I wait till the last minute to register for an event?**

**A:** We would appreciate if you registered on time for events. If a weekend is involved the food order is placed the weekend prior to the event, if you neglected to register on-time we do not know to order food for you. There is also a whole series of reports and lists that help the lodge function for the event and these have to be produced ahead of time.

**Q: My name is not on the Vigil eligibility list, why not?**

**A:** The list contains members who have been Brotherhood for two years and who have their current year dues paid. You might have been late paying your dues and missed the cutoff date for publicizing the information.

**Q: Why didn't I receive my Jan/Feb Wolf's Tale, I paid my 2004 dues by Dec 31.**

**A:** The Herbie Hawk/Wolf's Tale went to the printer the 15th of December. All payments received in the Scout Office by that date had labels made for them. Any payments received after the 15th were processed in January.

**Q: Can you send me an issue of Wolf's Tale that I missed?**

**A:** No, we do not print extra copies. A electronic version is posted on the Lodge Web Site and you can print your own version directly.

The lodge chief appoints a Vigil Honor nominating committee chairman and committee members composed of youths who have been approved by the lodge advisor and Scout executive...A committee of five to ten youths has been found effective in many lodges. (this number, if it is five or all vigil honor youths is to be determined by the current years Lodge Chief)...

In making the selection of Vigil Honor candidates, the nominating committee may reach agreement...if a vote is taken in order to select Vigil Honor candidates, only those members younger than age 21 may vote, as in all OA Matters...

An adult will also be appointed by the Lodge Adviser to sit on the committee.

With the adoption of national policy for the Vigil Honor Candidacy there are still many decisions that need to be made within the new adopted procedure. We have not yet established the actual agenda of the meeting but it will be decided and announced in a reasonable amount of time before the selection.

If there are any questions, comments, or concerns, a copy of this policy can be found at the council office or you may contact our Lodge Chief Bobby Cook or Lodge advisor Roger Mory, whose numbers can all be found on the back side of the Wolfs Tale. We encourage any and all brothers with any concern, youth and adult alike, to voice their opinions to us via phone or email. All concerns that are voiced will be taken into our utmost consideration when finalizing the selection process. Thank you for your time and cooperation in discussing this issue.
