If you or someone you know would like to run in opposition to the proposed slate, the following process, outlined in the Lodge Bylaws, Article 5 Section C, should be followed.

"The nominating committee will present a slate of officers consisting of Chief, (2) two Vice-Chiefs (as a cluster), Secretary, and Treasurer. The slate of officers will be presented at the April general membership meeting, (normally April) and published in the lodge newsletter prior to the following general membership meeting (normally May/June). Additional nominations may be received by petition of fifteen (15) active members, in writing. The petition may list (1) chief, (2) vice-chiefs (as a cluster), and/or (1) secretary, and/or (1) treasurer. The petition must be addressed to the Lodge Secretary, c/o Kittatinny Lodge #5, Order of the Arrow, at the Council Service Center. Nominations shall close at the end of the business day fifteen days prior to the election meeting. There shall be no nominations from the floor at the election meeting."

I think we keep our unique clan system, but if clans are to survive, they must have a clearly defined set of goals and a purpose. Keeping the original intent of Clans in mind, I've put some thought into this, and here are some suggestions . . .

That each Clan should:

- 1) Elect a Clan Chieftain from within it's own members at the same time as the new officers are elected and shall hold office for a term of one year. It shall be the responsibility of the Chieftain to see that the clan meets it's annual goal and to report it's accomplishments to the Executive Committee.
- 2) Conduct one community service project per year. This project should be selected by the clan members of the clan, be coordinated by the Chieftain under the guidance of the Clan Adviser, and should be significant.
- 3) Conduct a special camp service project each year, coordinated through the Lodge Service Committee and/or the Council Camping Committee, which will add to the over-all camping program.
- 4) Hold at least one off-season (ie: Winter) activity to keep it's members active and in touch during off months.
- 5) Allow Clans to have an identity in the form of limited clothing items or memorabilia, which would need to be approved by the Executive Committee and would be sold through Kittatinny Inc.
- 6) Be officially recognized in the Lodge Bylaws, and that Clan Chieftains be given voting rights on the Executive Committee.

If nothing else, I hope this will stimulate some serious though about Clans. They have great potential, but they need guidance and direction. I ask the present and future officers, clan chieftains and advisers to think about why they exist, and strive to make them fun, productive, and leadership builders.
