## Changes to Lodge By-Laws Proposed

The Executive Committee will be reviewing proposed changes to the Lodge By-Laws at the January meeting. The last time the By-Laws were updated was in 1993. The proposed changes reflect new Lodge programs introduced as well as changes to better manage the day-to-day operations of the Lodge.

Members interested in commenting on the proposed By-Laws changes should attend the January 31st Executive meeting, or contact the lodge chief or Adviser.

If the proposed changes are approved by the Executive Committee they will be presented for vote by the general membership at an upcoming Quarterly Meeting.

For your convenience, we are listing only the proposed changes here. For a complete listing of the current By-Laws, visit kittatinny5.org and you will find them listed under the menu option for General Information.

### Article IV - Paragraph B

**Old:** The Vigil Honor Committee Chairman shall be chosen by the Lodge Chief, with the approval of the Lodge Adviser.

**New:**The Vigil Honor Committee members and chairman shall be chosen by the Lodge Chief, with the approval of the Lodge Adviser.

### Article V - Paragraph B

**Old:** Lodge Officers shall be elected at the May/June Lodge Meeting. The term of office shall be from August 1 to July 31.

**New:** Lodge Officers shall be elected at the May/June Lodge Meeting. The term of office shall commence and conclude at the conclusion of the current year's Conclave, after the Sunday Section Meeting.

### Article V - Paragraph H

**Old:** In the event that the chief is unable to fulfill his duties, the succession of office is: (1) First Vice-Chief (2) Second Vice-Chief, with approval of the Executive Committee and the Lodge Adviser.

**New:** In the event that the chief is unable to fulfill his duties, the succession of office is: (1) Vice-Chief of Administration (2) Vice-Chief of Activities, with approval of the Executive Committee and the Lodge Adviser or If otherwise designated by the Lodge Chief prior to the event given the Lodge Advisor and Staff Advisor are notified along with the individual.

### Article 9 - Paragraph C

Added: The lodge participation award is a 4year award in which any brother may attain according to the requirements approved and available online and at the Council's Service Center.

So if you are looking for a good time, good food, and lots of fun then come on down (or up) to camp for all the fun and excitement that is to come!





## AN ARROWMAN'S PRIORITIES

Think about the Scouts in your unit who have not yet been elected to the Lodge. To them the Order of the Arrow may be a total mystery...an organization cloaked in secrecy and unknown traditions. There is also the possibility that they may see the OA membership as an elitist group that only wants to be involved with other OA members. It is up to us to make sure that others don't see the OA that way, and to make sure the Order is seen for what it truly is....a brotherhood of cheerful service. So how is that done?

Initially, we need to remember that an Arrowman's primary responsibility is to the Arrowman's unit. Don't forget, it was the members of your unit who elected you to the Lodge, regardless of whether they were OA members or not. They saw in you the camping ability, scout spirit, and leadership qualities that made you worthy of election. They rightfully expect that you will use your involvement in the OA to enhance your dedication and service to the Troop, Team, or Crew. Therefore, your Scouting priorities should be to your unit first, and then to your Lodge.

OK, so how do you use your involvement in the OA to help your unit? First of all, make sure that you are a friend to each member of your unit. A Scout is friendly, remember? That means that you must show friendship to the newest or youngest member, not just to those who are your age or to those with whom you have shared experiences. It means that you take every opportunity to show the new Scout how to tie that knot, or properly do that first aid technique. Respect their points of view, in the spirit of your both holding the common values of Scouting. Be consistent, so as to deserve the trust of your unit members A Scout is trustworthy, remember?

Secondly, be a leader, and more importantly, be an effective

leader. Set the example for the members of your unit. Live the Scout Law and Scout Oath, and let them see it. Communicate well, and be organized.

Thirdly, talk up the positive aspects of the OA with your unit, and encourage your unit's OA Representative to do the same. Promote summer camp attendance, and keep your unit members updated about OA activities.

Finally, let your unit see how you take the spirit of cheerful service to heart. Stay involved, even after you reach the rank of Eagle. Participate in unit programs and service projects enthusiastically, and guide the other unit members in participating cheerfully.

The image that the Order of the Arrow has at a unit level is up to YOU and your fellow Arrowmen. Make a difference in promoting OA, and your experience as an Arrowman in the Lodge will grow ever stronger.
