Proposed Slate of Officers for Next Year

The Slate of officers for next year has been announced!

Lodge Chief: Richie Tylka
Vice-Chief Administration: Ben Novinger
Vice-Chief Activities: Jonathan Fritz
Secretary: Casey Miller
Treasurer: Dan Althouse

The Lodge Bylaws state in Article V - Officers:

A. The officers of this Lodge shall be: Lodge Chief, (2) two Lodge Vice-Chiefs, Lodge Secretary, and Lodge Treasurer. They must be under twenty-one years of age for the entire term of office, registered in scouting and in good standing with the Order of the Arrow.

B. Lodge Officers shall be elected at the May/June Lodge Meeting. The term of office shall commence and conclude at the conclusion of the current years Conclave after the Sunday Section Meeting (this includes all positions of the Lodge Leadership, adult and youth alike).

C. The nominating committee will present a slate of officers consisting of Chief, (2) two Vice-Chiefs (as a cluster), Secretary, and Treasurer. The slate of officers will be presented at the April general membership meeting, (normally April) and published in the lodge

newsletter prior to the following general membership meeting (normally May/June). Additional nominations may be received no later than 15 days prior to the election. Petitions will consist of the applicants personal information along with the signature of the Lodge Advisor and Scout Executive. The petition may list (1) chief, (2) vice-chiefs (as a cluster), and/or (1) secretary, and/or (1) treasurer. The petition must be addressed to the Lodge secretary and Staff Advisor, c/o Kittatinny Lodge #5, Order of the Arrow.

D. Voting members of the Executive Committee shall be: Elected officers and standing committee chairmen

E. The Executive Committee shall comprise: Elected officers, Operating Committee Chairmen and the Advisers, immediate past Lodge Chief and Lodge Advisor, and a member of the Council Camping Committee.

Kittatinny Lodge Remembers Earl P. Moyer, Respected Scouter and former Minsi Lodge 5 Chief

On March 7, 2005, Kittatinny Lodge lost one of it's long-time and honored members, Earl P. Moyer, aged 77, who died after a long illness. Earl's involvement in our lodge included positions as Minsi Lodge 5 Chief (1954-1956), Kittatinny Lodge 5 Adviser (1976-1985), and Membership Committee Adviser (1986-2003). He began his life of dedication to the principals of the Order as an Ordeal member on October 18, 1950. He was honored with the Vigil honor on

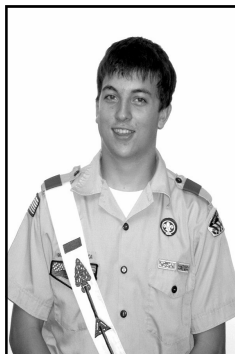
October 21, 1961, and took the name "Kikes Memhallamund" which translated means "He Who Trades," reflecting his interest in patch collecting. Those who knew Earl knew that he maintained the most complete set of lodge memorabilia.

He started his Scouting career in 1939 as a member of Troop 42 Mount Penn, later serving as Scoutmaster of Troop 46, serving until 1976. In other areas of Scouting, Earl was a respected

Wood Badger, a member of the Clark Patrol, and had assisted with many Wood Badge training courses both in and out of Council. He also served as Scoutmaster of course NE-IV-64 where he introduced the Burnham Patrol verse to the Wood Badge song, which he wrote in honor of "Green Bar Bill" Hilcourt. He was also involved in many other aspects of youth and adult training in Hawk Mountain Council.

In 1978 he was awarded the William N. Kline Award from the United Way for outstanding volunteer efforts by an individual. He had over 60 years of service with the Hawk Mountain Council and more than 25,000 hours of service over the years. He also received the Silver Beaver award in 1993.

Earl was a member of St John's UCC Church, Reading, where he served as a member of the consistory, as well as a Sunday school teacher. Earl was a US Army veteran of the Korean War. In honor of his contributions to the lodge and scouting and of his warm friendship, a group of Scouters sang the Song of the Order at the gravesite as a parting farewell. Earl will be missed, but fondly remembered.

Earl P. Moyer Training Center

One of Earl Moyer's parting wishes was to make a lasting contribution to training in the Hawk Mountain Council, so part of his estate will be put towards a dedicated training building on camp property. The Council will honor these wishes, expanding and enclosing the current "Kittatinny Room"/Nature pavilion, which will be designated the "Earl P. Moyer Training Center". The current plan is to have the building ready for use by June 1, 2006, in time to be showcased when Kittatinny Lodge 5 hosts the 2006 NE-IV Section Conclave.

WHY BROTHERHOOD?

Hey, you were elected by your troop to the Order of the Arrow, and you went to an OA weekend last April or May for your Ordeal. You got a great sash for your uniform. You went back to the next troop meeting and your friends checked it out. At Scout Camp last summer you took your sash and wore it on OA Day. You're in the Order of the Arrow. You've got that flap on your uniform. Why not just let it go at that?

Maybe you are thinking of OA membership the wrong way. Membership in the Order of the Arrow is not just about being elected by the other guys in your troop. It's about SERVICE and OPPORTUNITY.

Why were you elected? Not because it's a popularity contest, but because your fellow Scouts recognized your dedication to Scouting and to the Scout Oath and Law. They saw in you the camping skills and leadership skills, and they wanted to give you an OPPORTUNITY beyond the troop to express those skills and that dedication. That opportunity is the Order of the Arrow. Will you take advantage of that opportunity, or will you just sit back and check out that flap on your uniform every once in a while? Did you forget that Obligation you accepted during your Ordeal weekend?

OK, you're willing to take another look at this OA opportunity. How do you do it? First, by taking the next step along the path of the "long and toilsome journey"... Brotherhood membership.

Brotherhood membership marks the completion of your induction into the Order of the Arrow, after a minimum of 10 months as an Ordeal member. When you take the time to read the OA Handbook and other materials provided to you by the Lodge, in preparation to take the Brotherhood Review, you can really begin to appreciate what it means to be in the Order of the Arrow. It all begins to come into focus and really makes a difference in how you see yourself as an "honor scout". You see what cheerful SERVICE means and how it benefits your troop, your community, and yourself. You miss a great opportunity to see the true meaning of Scouting when you pass on OA Brotherhood.

Becoming a Brotherhood member is not difficult; probably most of your friends in the Lodge have taken the Brotherhood Review, either at an OA weekend or during their week at Summer Camp. Do yourself a big favor, and at the same time do your Lodge a big favor, and commit to become a Brotherhood member no later than the September weekend. Seal your bonds in Brotherhood with your fellow Lodge members. You'll be glad you did!
