I guess I kind of walked myself into a corner with these health and safety tips of the issue so here it is. Drum roll please. The 2nd Bicentennial Celebratory Silver Edition Volume 23 semiannual Kittatinny Lodge 5 in Association with Hawk Mountain Scout Reservation Health and Safety tip is..... FIRST DEGREE BURNS!! As the sun begins to finally break us out of that frigid winter its time to slip on the bathing suit and lather on the sunscreen. First degree burn is the fancy medical term for sunburn, which is caused by the harmful ultraviolet rays given off by the sun which can cause skin cancer and other skin diseases if you leave yourself unprotected. The result of receiving a First Degree Burn is a cherry red coloring on the skin that is extremely sensitive and painful to touch. The best way to treat sunburn is to prevent it, always wear your sunscreen and it should have at LEAST SPF 15, but to be safe you should be using the SPF 30 or SPF 45. If you do get this annoyingly painful burn the best way to treat it is with Aloe, which comes from the Aloe plant and soothes the burning sensation. Usually you can find Aloe Vera or other products made specifically for soothing sunburn. Remember to have fun in the sun, but not until you've gotten lathered up in that sunscreen.

The Order of the Arrow has had a long-standing interest in coordinating a national service project, utilizing the infrastructure and leadership established over many years of success at the Boy Scouts of America's high adventure bases. Working closely together, the United States Forest Service and the OA have chosen five project sites, spread across America, that will be the focus of our combined efforts. ArrowCorps⁵ (pronounced Arrow Corps Five) will provide a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity for each participant to set an example of leadership in service to those who treasure our national forests.

Five thousand physically fit and able Arrowmen (determined by the "Philmont Weight Limits for Backpacking & Hiking"), made up of youth and adults, will participate. The national Order of the Arrow committee and key sponsors will fund the projects. Participants will pay a reasonable fee to help pay for accommodations, meals, and a full day of recreational activities during the projects.

Have you ever seen the Northern Lights or portaged a canoe? If not, then the Order of the Arrow has the opportunity for you to participate in the OA Voyage Program at Northern Tier Canoe Base in Ely, Minnesota.

Not very many people whom you go to school with or work with can say that they have paddled 185 miles by canoe to International Falls or portaged the final 4 miles that leads to Lake Superior.
