
Brothers,



Proposed Bylaw Amendment

Wording in the current bylaws being amended is struck through.

Wording in the amended bylaw is emphasized in bold.

Article V- Officers

Paragraph 2:

Summary

This proposed bylaw change would change the term of office duration from January through December to June through May.

Current: "Lodge Officers shall be elected at the September Lodge Meeting. The term of office shall conclude at the conclusion of the current calendar year, December 31, and the new term of office shall commence at the beginning of the new year, January 1, each year (this includes all positions of the Lodge Leadership, adult and youth alike) All terms are for one year (youth and adult) with renewal at the discretion of the Lodge Chief (youth) or Lodge Adviser (adults)."

Amendment: "Lodge Officers shall be elected at the May Lodge Meeting. The term of office shall conclude at the conclusion of the Section Conclave, and the new term of office shall commence at the conclusion of Section Conclave (this includes all positions of the Lodge Leadership, adult and youth alike) All terms are for one year (youth and adult) with renewal at the discretion of the Lodge Chief (youth) or Lodge Adviser (adults)."

Paragraph 3:

Current: "The nominating committee will present a slate of officers consisting of Chief, (2) two Vice-Chiefs (as a cluster), Secretary, and Treasurer. The slate of officers will be presented at the May general membership meeting (normally May) and published in the lodge newsletter prior to the following general membership meeting (normally September). Additional nominations may be received no later than 15 days prior to the election. Petitions will consist of the applicants' personal information along with the signature of the Lodge Adviser and Staff Adviser. The petition may list (1) chief, (2) vice-chiefs (as a cluster), and/or (1) secretary, and/or (1) treasurer. The petition will enact an election at the September (normally September) general membership meeting where the individual filing the petition will be running against the slated officer position for which they filed the petition. The petition must be addressed to the Lodge secretary and Staff Adviser, c/o Kittatinny Lodge #5, Order of the Arrow. Any elections resulting from petitions filed shall be decided when one candidate receives a majority of the votes cast."

Amendment: "The nominating committee will present a slate of officers consisting of Chief, (2) two Vice-Chiefs (as a cluster), Secretary, and Treasurer. The slate of officers will be presented at the April general membership meeting (normally April) and published in the lodge website and other appropriate channels prior to the following general membership meeting (normally May). Additional nominations may be received no later than 15 days prior to the election. Petitions will consist of the applicants' personal information along with the signature of the Lodge Adviser and Staff Adviser. The petition may list (1) chief, (2) vice-chiefs (as a cluster), and/or (1) secretary, and/or (1) treasurer. The petition will enact an election at the May (normally May) general membership meeting where the individual filing the petition will be running against the slated officer position for which they filed the petition. The petition must be addressed to the Lodge secretary and Staff Adviser, c/o Kittatinny Lodge #5, Order of the Arrow. Any elections resulting from petitions filed shall be decided when one candidate receives a majority of the votes cast."

Lodge Participation Award

With just a little work, you can get started earning the 4-part (black wolf dangler patch and 3 pin segments) Kittatinny Lodge Participation Award. Most of it you can do just by being an active member in your unit and attending OA Weekends. Start by earning the patch and then in subsequent years you earn each of the pins. It takes 4 years to earn the complete award set.

The requirements for each of the four segments are the same: Complete FOUR of the following:

- 1) Attend 2 service weekends and one quarterly meeting;
- Attend a Lodge Executive Meeting, Conclave, or other Lodge event;
- 3) Attend Summer Camp or a High Adventure camp;
- 4) Attend 75% of your Troop's meetings;
- 5) Attend 2 troop campouts (other than extended camp);
- 6) Teach a Scout a new skill.

Once you have completed these, talk to the Lodge Chief, or an Exec Committee Member about what you have done and what you are planning to do for your Troop and the O.A. in the future.

The Legend of the Crow-an old Lenape Legend

"The Rainbow Crow was beautiful to hear and to see, back in the days when it never got cold, back in the Ancient Days, before Snow Spirit appeared in the World.

When the Snow Spirit did appear, all the people and animals were freezing and a messenger was selected to go up to kijilamuh ka'ong, The Creator Who Creates By Thinking What Will Be. The messenger was to ask The Creator to think of the World as being warm again so that they would not all freeze to death.

Rainbow Crow was chosen to go and he flew upward for three days. He got the Creator's attention by singing beautifully, but even though he begged the Creator to make it warm again, the Creator said He could not, because He had thought of Cold and He could not unthink it. But He did think of Fire, a thing that could warm the creatures even when it was cold. And so He poked a stick into the Sun until it was burning, and the gave it to Rainbow Crow to carry back to earth for the creatures. The Creator told Rainbow Crow to hurry before it burned all up.

Rainbow Crow dove down and flew as fast as he could go. The burning stick charred all of his beautiful feathers until they were black and since he was carrying the stick in his beak, he breathed the smoke and heat until his voice was hoarse.

And so the Rainbow Crow was black and had an unpleasant cawing voice forever after, but all the creatures honored him, for he had brought Tindeh, fire, for everyone to use.

The Crow is to this day, still honored by hunters and animals, who never kill it for food...and, if you look closely at the Crow's black feathers you can still see many colors gleaming in the black."



VOICES OF THE PAST

Looking Ahead to the Lodge Centennial

Believe it or not, Kittatinny Lodge 5 will turn 100 in just four short years from now.

As one of the nation's oldest Order of the Arrow lodges, Kittatinny has a long and distinguished history of service. Founded on July 1, 1921, Lodge #5 was initially called Indiandale Lodge, named after the council camp at the time. Several months later the name was changed to Minsi and the timber wolf was adopted as the Lodge's totem.

Fifty years later---in August of 1971---Minsi Lodge and neighboring Memeu Lodge merged to create Kittatinny Lodge 5. The merger was necessitated by the creation of the Hawk Mountain Council that same year, bringing together the Daniel Boone Council, based in Berks Country, and Schuylkill County's Appalachian Trail Council.

The creation of Kittatinny Lodge was celebrated at a special Conclave attended by 350 members at the Daniel Boone Council's Camp Shikellamy, near Bethel. The August 1971 event also commemorated Minsi Lodge's 50th anniversary and the dedication of a new Lodge building and ceremonial ring at Shikellamy.



Some of us are old enough to remember this historic event. As Minsi's last Lodge Chief, I had the privilege of serving as master of ceremonies that day. I read aloud a handwritten letter to the Conclave written by Order of the Arrow Founder E. Urner Goodman, who was present when Lodge #5 was established a half century before, working side by side with Arthur Schuck, the local Council Executive in Berks County who would later because the Boy Scouts of America's Chief Scout Executive.



Former Minsi Chief Jerry Andrews (1965) just sent me another letter from Dr. Goodman, which includes the OA founder's recollections of Minsi Lodge's origins. By the way, Dr. Goodman also signed Jerry's Brotherhood sash. Jerry wouldn't, however, have the opportunity to wear it because he earned Vigil Honor soon after receiving Dr. Goodman's letter and the signed sash.

I still have the program from the 50th Conclave, which lists the names of speakers from both Minsi and Memeu Lodges, each describing their respective Lodge's history, decade by decade. Among the featured speakers that day were Chester Quinter, a Minsi Lodge member from the 1930's. While Memeu Lodge was younger and smaller than Minsi (at the time, Minsi had more than 1,000 members!), great care was taken to be sure that its rich history was honored during the event.


The merger itself was complicated, in part because each of our lodges had such long and rich heritages and traditions.


I recently retired and have spent time sorting through a box of memorabilia from my time as Lodge Chief. I have a number of copies of the Wolf's Tale newsletter from the late 60's, as well as posters and programs and even a special neckerchief and color pin developed expressly for the 50th anniversary. I'm eager to contribute many of these items to the Lodge's archives. Among my collection of pictures is a shot of Jerry Andrews presenting me with an incredible Eagle-feather bonnet he had just completed to be passed down by the Chiefs. I wonder if the headdress is still in use? All of this reminds me of many of the men and boys who contributed so much to the Lodge during that period. While I was Lodge Chief, it fell to me to represent the Lodge at a memorial service for Larry Hoch, a former Lodge Chief who died in Vietnam while serving in the U.S. Marine Corps. No one who was active in the Lodge during that period will forget our dedicated Lay Advisor, Scotty Webster and many other dedicated adult leaders. Men like Earl Moyer, who always wore a campaign hat and impeccably pressed uniforms, and Lodge Advisor Dick Feick, who was a familiar presence at all Lodge events. Former Lodge Chiefs like Jerry Andrews, Scott Althouse, Dennis Epler, Drew Stump, Craig Long and Dan Reiniger were inspirational leaders who helped carry forward a long legacy of effective leadership. My own Scoutmaster, Charlie Coldren, urged me to become active in OA, to join the Shikellamy staff and later work at Philmont in New Mexico. He pinned the Eagle badge on my uniform shirt when I was 16. Several years later I was pleased to present him with his Vigil Honor sash.

Looking back, the 50th Conclave almost 46 years ago was a major milestone in the history of our Lodge.

I'm sure I speak for many current and former Lodge members as I encourage today's Lodge leaders to begin preparing a very special commemoration to mark the Lodge's 100th anniversary in 2021. I hope to be there to join in the festivities!
