## OA Summer Camp Activities 2014

Kittatinny V is known for its outstanding summer camp program. All troops are strongly encouraged to take part in as many OA events at camp as possible.

### Kittatinny Award-

This award can be earned by all youth and adult campers. Forms will be given out early in the week and should be turned in by Friday afternoon. The Kittatinny award requires scouts and leaders to actively participate and provide service during their week at camp. Upon completion of the award scouts and leaders receive the annual Kittatinny award and can stamp new logos on their neckerchief.

### New Camper Ceremony-

The new camper ceremony takes place after the opening campfire. It is here that Native American principles give each scout the green Kittatinny neckerchief.

### OA Visitation-

After scheduling with the summer chieftain at the indian village, members of the OA will visit campsites and field any questions that campers may have about the OA and Kittatinny.

### Brotherhood Ceremony-

Current Ordeal members can seal their ties in the Brotherhood. To be eligible, arrowmen must have been and ordeal member for ten months and paid their dues (if applicable). Anyone interested in taking their brotherhood should bring \$18 and a carved arrow to the indian village on Tuesday night (time TBA).

### Wednesday OA Day-

Lodge members are encouraged to wear their lodge shirts during the day to show lodge spirit.

### Callout Ceremony-

Following Wednesday night chapel, campers line up and are circled into the indian village by scouts in Native American regalia. Campers then witness the violent struggle between the aged chieftain and young warrior. After the fight, OA principles come across the lake and tell the story behind the battle which has just taken place. Campers present who have been elected to the OA within the past year are then gathered and taken to their own separate ceremony. All arrowmen are then invited to a cracker barrel in the pavilion afterwards.

### Friday Recognition Ceremony-

During the Friday night campfire, Vigil, Brotherhood and Ordeal members are recognized in front of the entire camp and presented with a cutting of hemlock.
