The Flaming Torch Dance was performed by Wyona Lodge #18. This dance consists of a group of less experienced dancers entering the circle first, followed by those more experienced. The experienced dancers then have a contest, light their torches and finish the dance.

The Grass Dance, done by Wunita Gohkos Lodge #39, was a traditional dance done by the Plains Indians. The dancers start with a freestyle dance, then enter into a synchronized dance, then the dancers close with two freestyle dances.

Kittatinny Lodge #5 performed a Lenape Stomp Dance. The dance performed had two elements, a Friendship Stomp and a Challenge by the lead dancer.

The dance competition was a fascinating look at a cultural legacy which has been entrusted to the Order of the Arrow to maintain.


Dave Sargent
