I moved up as Lodge Secretary and Lodge Vice-Chief of Administration in the following two years. Last year, my freshman year of college, I took a little time off and served the lodge mainly through the LLDC and my ceremonies parts, at that time including Kitchkinet of the Pre-Ordeal. And then... I found myself as chief.
