Announcing Online Membership Status

 \mathfrak{A} t the January Executive meeting, Membership Committee adviser Joe Pietruszynski announced that a collaboration of the Membership and Web Committees has resulted in a new interactive service available to all lodge members: Online Membership Status checking.

A link on the Membership Committee page allows you to enter your Lodge ID number (the four-digit number found on your membership card) and the resulting page will return your dues status, your Brotherhood eligibility status, if you are an adult with over two years since you took your Ordeal, dates you took your Ordeal, Brotherhood, or Vigil, and if we have recorded payment towards any lodge activities for the current year. Activity payments will only appear if dues are current.

The Membership Committee has always collected and maintained this information, but it was only available to them since the records were stored in a single computer file. "We wanted that information to be of service to members themselves," stated Pietruszynski. "Members can now save a call to find out if they are paid up". The online lookup file will be updated regularly, but there may be small delays from the time you turn in payments until they appear in the lookup file. Currently, the file is being updated about 2-3 times a month.

Another link on the Membership Committee page allows users to update their contact information. Once you joined the OA and gave us your contact information, we had no way of knowing if you moved, changed phone numbers, or changed units. This feature now gives you the ability to let us know about these types of changes and helps keep the lodge records more accurate, and Wolf's Tale coming to you.

This collaboration marks the first use of interactive services on our web site. Future plans are to give members access to their participation history as well. Members will be able to see which OA service weekends and other events they participated in over the past years. Troop OA Reps may be able to use this information to encourage Arrowmen who have not been very active in the Lodge to come back and try out an OA Weekend. To check out your status, point your browser to www.kittatinny5.org, and using the menu go to "General Information", "Committees", then click the link on the Membership committee. For faster access, you can go directly to www.kittatinny5.org/committees/membership and click on the link "Lookup Your Membership Status." We've put a link on the main page too.

New Service Weekend Check-in Policies

Uhis year, there will be changes in the signin process throughout the weekend.

On Friday night, the Check-in for current OA members will take place in the ADMIN building. When you arrive at the ADMIN building, you must sign in using the new and improved sign-in/signout binder. Once signed in you will receive your wristband. The wristband must be worn at ALL times and must be visible when in the dining hall. You will then check-in with me, Josh Nimmerichter, and I will check you in to camp and you may sign up for your cabin. Please take note of the adult and youth cabins. In a youth cabin, there must be two individuals over 18 years of age (a Scouting adult). In an adult cabin there is to be absolutely no one under eighteen years of age. If, at sometime during the weekend, you decide to change cabins, you MUST move your name on the sheets found at the Admin building.

If you show up late to the weekend (Saturday) you must sign in at the Admin building and you must check in with me or my adviser, Joe Pietruszynski, at the dining hall during the NEXT meal. Check-in procedures will only take place before and immediately after meals (including cracker-barrel). If you must leave sometime during the weekend (INCLUDING SUNDAY MORNING) you must sign out in the sign-in/signout binder at the Admin building. The Admin building will not be staffed but the binder will be on the bench outside (just like Summer Camp). If you come back to camp you must re-sign in at the Admin building, but you do NOT need to check-in with me unless you have removed your wristband. Also, at NO point in time may you DRIVE your vehicle in camp without permission from the Chief or with a Parking Permit issued by me during check-in. A friendly reminder to those that do drive in camp - the speed limit is still 5 MPH.

As you all know, the lodge is run by the youth. Only those under 21 have voting power. It is crucial that the youth of our lodge take a more active role in communicating. In recent years, the adults of the lodge have had to take on a more active role to ensure that things get done. In the Wolf's Tale, for example, A good bit of this edition's articles came from adult advisors. It is like pulling teeth to get youth articles. A lack of communication only results in separation, division, and isolation within the lodge. So please, take Wolf's Tale into consideration next time you sit at your computer.

"The best way to predict the future is to create it." Check-in for candidates taking their Ordeal will take place in the CUB SCOUT DINING HALL. Candidates taking their Ordeal will sign in for the cabins during the Saturday night cracker-barrel. Candidates belongings will already be in their cabin prior to dinner and at cracker-barrel they will just sign the sheet to let us know where they are. Hopefully these changes will make the weekends more enjoyable for all, especially those of us concerned with safety issues within camp. Please try to follow these guidelines as closely as possible to avoid problems. If you have any questions feel free to contact me via email or on the phone.

"TWELVE CUBED" - OA At The Jamboree

 ${f eta}$ ne of the mountaintop experiences of Scouting is the National Jamboree, and I hope each of you will have the chance to attend the 2005 Jamboree at A.P. Hill this summer, either with the Council contingency, your unit, or a day trip. It's not to be missed! Where else can you share fun and adventure with 40,000 people who share the values that make Scouting great?

The Stage Shows, Merit Badge Midway, National Exhibits, Brownsea Island, the Action Centers...there's something going on constantly and you're never bored! All of these support the Jamboree's theme: "On My Honor, Timeless Values.'

The Order of the Arrow is a key player in all of the activities at the Jamboree, and if you attend, make

sure you visit and participate in the OA events. The OA runs four areas within the Jamboree, which are the OA Service Corps, TOAP, OA Shows, and the OA Indian Village. TOAP, the Outdoor Adventure Place hosted by the OA, gives Scouts the opportunity to test their camping and outdoor skills, and view the latest BSA camping equipment. At the OA American Indian Village, Native American-style dance performances and demonstrations are presented in the morning, and in the afternoons, the staff demonstrates and teaches various crafts such as beadwork, porcupine guillwork, and teach Indian games. Scouts can also work on the Indian Lore merit badge. OA lodge ceremonies teams can join the dance circle.

The main OA production at the 2005 Jamboree is "Twelve Cubed". This is the successor to previous OA jamboree productions such as "Odyssey of the Law" (1997), and "Scoutopia" (2001). 12³ represents an equation for life, a formula for values. It is the value obtained by applying to one's life both the 12 points of the Scout Law and the 3 promises of the Scout Oath: a multiplication, if you will, which has an exponential effect upon that life. The show begins in a laboratory, a lab for building a life. The purpose is explained as

"exploring the ingredients and assembling the elements of character, of values". In a world full of people who think stupid thoughts and do stupid things, there is hope...because there is something called character. Thus we search to discover character, which makes a boy whole. Twelve Cubed promises to be the best OA production ever. Each of us in Kittatinny 5 should work to be Twelve Cubed

every day. Now that spring is here, it's time to refocus on all of the fun and friendship that we enjoy

here in Kittatinny 5. It's going to be an exciting year, with lots of opportunities for cheerful service. Preparations for Conclave 2006 will be a major priority, and we need everyone's involvement.
