## Service, Tradition, Honor

This summer my son and I attended the 90<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebration of the Order of the Arrow at Treasure Island Scout Camp. The camp is located on an island on the Delaware River between Allentown and Philadelphia.

In the spring of 2005 severe rains caused the river to rise and flood the island thus destroying Treasure Island Scout Camp and canceling the 2005 camping season. At the anniversary celebration we spoke to Unami Lodge Officers and to help them with a day of cheerful service working on the camp.

On Oct. 22, 2005 a group of 10 scouts and 5 leaders representing Kittatinny Lodge, traveled to Treasure Island Scout Camp for a service project to help with camp reconstruction. We met Ranger Mark and took a boat cross the Delaware River to access the camp. Imagine that when you go to scout camp everything you take with you must go down a 25 feet embankment, be loaded onto a boat for a trip across 80 yards of water, and then carried up another 25 feet embankment and off to your camp site. It makes you appreciate how good we have it at HMSR.

Our job for the day was to take the Health

Lodge completely apart down to the main framework. We took out windows, walls, doors, ceiling, bunks, closets and even the bathroom toilet. This was done so Unami Lodge could check the structural integrity of the Health Lodge for rebuilding. At the end of the day, our group took a tour of the island and visited the historical birthplace of the Order of the Arrow. We were able to see and walk through Unami Lodge's Ceremony Circle where E. Urner Goodman and Carrol Edison founded the Order.

As we were leaving Treasure Island, Ranger Mark informed us that for every 1 inch of rain north of Allentown the Delaware River will rise approximately 1.5 feet. The camp experiences some minor flooding every year. Occasionally the entire island is covered with water as occurred in 2005. The Ranger was extremely pleased with our help and presented everyone with a camp neckerchief Patch. I would like to thank all the scouts and leaders that represented Kittatinny Lodge in an act of cheerful service for our fellow brothers in Unami Lodge.

## Who is worthy of the Vigil Honor Recognition ?

The Vigil honor is bestowed by special selection and is limited to one person for every 50 members registered with the lodge each year.

Any member of the Order of the Arrow registered in Scouting and in good standing in a regularly chartered lodge is eligible for recommendation to the national Order of the Arrow Committee for elevation to the Vigil Honor, provided that, at the time of the recommendation, the individual has been a Brotherhood member for a minimum of 2 years.

Alertness to the needs of others is the mark of the Vigil Honor. It calls for an individual with an unusual awareness of the possibilities within each situation. The Vigil Honor is a high mark of distinction and recognition reserved for the Arrowmen who, by reason of exceptional service, personal effort, and unselfish interest, have

made distinguished contributions beyond the immediate responsibilities of their position or office to one or more of the following: their lodge, the Order of the Arrow, Scouting, or their Scout camp. Under no circumstances should tenure in Scouting or the Order of the Arrow be considered as reason enough for a Vigil Honor recommendation.

The Vigil nominating committee is seeking your input and recommendations. ## OUR LODGE: LOOKING BACK, LOOKING FORWARD

Want some motivation to get further involved in Kittatinny 5 and make it the best Lodge it can be? One great way is to look back and see where we started and where we have been. Sometimes our memories only go back a few years, or we think that the Lodge really didn't get going until recently. Was it in the '90s when our older brothers were doing Ceremonies? Or was it back in the ancient days when our fathers took their Ordeal in the '60s? Well, if that's what you're thinking, you're not thinking back nearly far enough. Try the early 1920s! 1921 to be exact. Yes, Lodge 5 Spirit has been alive for 85 years... just 11 years after Scouting started in the good old USA.

Have you ever heard of Indiandale? Camp Indiandale was the original Scout Camp in our area. Your great grandfather may have spent a week there during the summer, doing the same fun things that you do at HMSR. Back in 1921, our council's leaders were looking for ways to promote summer camp and service, and decided that this relatively new organization, the Wimachtendienk W.W., as the OA was then known, was the perfect way to do it. There were only 4 Lodges in existence in the United States at the time, and you may already know that the first was founded at Treasure Island Camp in the Philadelphia council. So Dr. E. Urner Goodman, the founder of OA, was contacted, and on July 21, 1921, the fifth lodge was installed: Indiandale Lodge 5. While we have the Wolf as our totem, the original lodge totem was the Bison. Back then, instead of Ordeal, Brotherhood, or Vigil membership as we now know it, the members were given First Degree, Second Degree, or Third Degree membership. Twenty Scouts joined the Lodge as charter members, and by the end of summer camp 1921, 21 additional Scouts and Scouters joined. All were First or Second Degree members. At the national "Grand Lodge" organizational meeting in the fall of that year, held at Camp Biddle in the Philadelphia Council, Indiandale Lodge 5 Gegeyjumhet (Supreme Chief of the Fire) Arthur Schuck was elected Eluwak Mawachpo, or Grand Treasurer.

On October 25, 1921, the name of the Lodge was changed to "Minsi Lodge" in honor of the tribe of Lenni Lenape who had lived in the area. A new lodge totem was selected: the Wolf. In

July, 1922, Arthur Schuck and Oliver Fryer were initiated as the first Minsi Lodge 5 members to receive the Third Degree membership, at Treasure Island. Schuck was given the name Walapeju, meaning "The Just", and Fryer received the name Tgauchsu, or "The Gracious". Minsi Lodge 5 hosted the second national Grand Lodge meeting at Camp Indiandale, and Arthur Schuck was elected as "Grand Chiefton", the equivalent of today's National Chief. The Sixth Grand Lodge meeting was held at Camp Indiandale in 1926, and Robert Henderson of Lodge 5 was elected to the post of Grand Chiefton of WWW, which he held for two years.

While the Order of the Arrow became an official program experiment of the Boy Scouts of America in 1922, it was approved as an official part of the Scouting program in 1934. In 1938, Memeu Lodge 125 was chartered to the Schuylkill Council. Minsi and Memeu Lodges continued actively with service to their respective councils until 1970, when the Daniel Boone Council and the Appalachian Trails Council merged into one council: Hawk Mountain Council. As a result of that merger, the two lodges merged, taking on the earlier number, and was renamed Kittatinny Lodge 5. Kittatinny means "The Endless Mountain". Our lodge has been, and continues to be, a leader and pacesetter, not only in the Section, but also in the Northeast Region. It is nationally recognized for its outstanding service and organization. In 2000, Jordan Hitchens, who had previously served as our Lodge Chief, served as the National Vice Chief, the second highest youth leader position in the OA in the entire nation. Kittatinny 5 has been a Quality Lodge for an amazing 16 years in a row!

We can all be proud of the history of our Lodge. We also know that we can't rest on our laurels. It is up to each of us to build on the past and continue to make Kittatinny 5 a great lodge in the present and future. Its up to you to do your part to continue the heritage! If you are not as active in the lodge as you could be, NOW is a great time to jump in. We have an exciting year ahead of us!

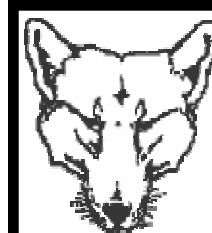
## Where To Go Camping Book Needs Your Input
