Ordeal Plus Thirty Years = Brotherhood

I don't remember exactly when my Ordeal took place. I can make a good guess though. While I had been a Cub and Boy Scout while living in California my family moved home to Central New York when I was fourteen. The OA memorabilia I have left from my youth is from the Taghajute Lodge of the Cayuga County Council in New York State. Incidentally, the very Lodge my nephew belongs to today. But aside from a Lodge neckerchief and memories of friends picking up an axe and performing a ceremonial dance while camping, or another friend arriving on a ten-speed bicycle wearing his uniform and a headdress, nothing. Certainly not Brotherhood.

Even after I left Scouts, I continued camping, sometimes more frequently than others. You have got to be a good camper to get into OA. And that love of camping carried over into my life even after I had left Scouts. A friend from my years in Albany and I still spend Columbus Day weekend in the Adirondacks, although I moved away from New York over a decade ago. Often our trips included his sons, both Scouts in their day, although by that time I was involved in a career with heavy travel requirements, and I played no role in their unit or any other. So no Brotherhood there.

After my son Joined Cub Scouts I was encouraged to 'reinstate' my OA membership so I could participate in the work weekends at camp. Work weekends were billed as a lot more fun than work by one of the adults in the Troop that our Pack fed into.

And you know, as an aside, it is. I had a great time building tent platforms last Fall - I got to use a nail gun! Call it fun for the simple-minded.

So I began trying to hunt up any evidence that I had ever been in OA. Well, my old council had no records. Any membership cards I had had were long gone. So I wrote a letter pleading for re-admittance, with only my honor as a Scout as proof that I had once been an Arrowman. And they actually let me in. I was even assigned an Ordeal date – July, 1977. Who knows when it was really, but close enough. Still, I wasn't thinking about Brotherhood. I just wanted to go to the work weekends, help out the camp, you know.

But then, Summer Camp. There I was, responsible for mother-henning two Pathfinders, my son one of them, for the week. And I found out that you can complete Brotherhood right there at Summer Camp. And I had been to lodge meetings, so I knew that Ordeal to Brotherhood conversion is important to maintaining our Quality Lodge status. And I thought to myself, how hard can it be?

It was both harder, and easier, than I could have known at the time. I needed a lot of help from the young Arrowmen, Scouts, there at camp. I don't know if I had ever memorized the Obligation as a youth, but I memorized it there at camp in an afternoon. I had help with responses to the questions I would be asked as I entered the Lodge campfire circle. A lot of help. But describing the lessons of the Ordeal was easy. Self denial, isolation, service to others. I can't speak to how I would have described the Ordeal thirty years ago, as a youth, but in that time I have been, continue to be, a father, husband, son and grandson, friend, employee. And in every one of those roles in life there are opportunities to do what is right, or to 'go along to get along', opportunities to take on work, and to strive to complete it cheerfully – or to leave it for someone else to do, and there is loneliness and opportunities missed never to return in doing so. But it is still the right thing to do, and the lesson of the Ordeal, for me, is that if you choose the harder path, you have the resources within yourself to see it through.

So there you have it. Ordeal, July 1977 and Brotherhood thirty years later - to the month.

The Order of the Arrow has had a long-standing interest in coordinating a national service project, utilizing the infrastructure and leadership established over many years of success at the Boy Scouts of America's high adventure bases. Working closely together, the United States Forest Service and the OA have chosen five project sites, spread across America, that will be the focus of our combined efforts. ArrowCorps⁵ (pronounced Arrow Corps Five) will provide a once-in-alifetime opportunity for each participant to set an example of leadership in service to those who treasure our national forests.

Five thousand physically fit and able volunteers (determined by the "Philmont Weight Limits for Backpacking & Hiking"), made up of youth and adults, will participate. The national Order of the Arrow committee and key sponsors will fund the projects. Participants will pay a reasonable fee to help pay for accommodations, meals, and a full day of recreational activities during the projects.

Additional information is available through the National Bulletin and National Order of the Arrow Web Site. Mark Twain National Forest was the first of the five sites to be featured starting in the 2006 with the other four sites following in 2007.
