KITTATINNY LODGE 5 - New York City Trip

For Lodge members, families, and guests
Saturday, March 20, 2010

Cost: \$30.00 / person

The Museum of the Native American Indian and time on your own in the city



Our trip will depart from the Council Service Center at 6:00am via motor coach, and head directly to New York City. Upon arrival in NYC, we will be dropped off at Battery Park on the southern tip of Manhattan.

To make this trip **flexible** and **affordable for families**, we are charging for **TRANSPORTATION ONLY**.

Lunch, dinner, and sight-seeing in the city will be on your own. Bring money for your expenses.

We encourage everyone to visit the Museum of the Native American Indian in the George Gustav Heye Center.

It has free admission, and is open 10:00am-5:00pm, The Staten Island Ferry (runs every 1/2 hour, 25 minute trip one way), is also free to the public. Other sights within walking distance include: World Trade Center site, Wall Street, and the South Street Seaport historic district. Walk a little further and you can be in Chinatown or Little Italy. If downtown doesn't suit you, hop the subway or taxi and head uptown to Broadway, Time Square, maybe catch a show. The day is yours to explore and enjoy.

Some, but not all, people have expressed an interest in visiting the Statue of Liberty and Ellis Island. To allow you the greatest flexibility in scheduling your day, you will need to **MAKE YOUR OWN ARRANGEMENTS** prior to going, as we will **NOT** be organizing a group visit. Your individual reservations should be made as soon as possible, as they are first-come, first-served, sell out quickly, and have multiple options. Your reservations should be made between 9am and 2pm to make sure you are there on time, and choose Battery Park as your origin point. Security screenings take place before boarding the ferry **AND** upon entering the monument. Plan accordingly (don't bring pocket knives!). Be aware that only 4 tickets to the crown can be booked per person.

We will be re-boarding the motor coach at 7:00pm at Battery Park where we were left off, and will drive home directly with no stops. We should return to the Council Service Center by around 9:30pm.

Trip reservations will be accepted on a first come first served basis until the bus is full. Verify you are confirmed before booking any sight seeing activities in NYC. Dress for March weather.
