What are the benefits of the Order of the Arrow's involvement in the Cub Scouting Program.

Benefits for the OA Member

- An Arrowman can be a role model and help a Cub Scout want to be like him
- An opportunity for an Arrowman to demonstrate and practice leadership and camping skills before an appreciative audience
- An opportunity for OA members to promote camping
- An opportunity for OA members to provide cheerful service to Scouting
- Arrowmen can help assure the future of Boy Scouting (more than 90 percent of Boy Scouts were Cub Scouts)

Benefits for Cub Scouts

- An opportunity for Cub Scouts to see older Boy Scouts in action and want to be like them
- Cub Scouts can see camping skills demonstrated by an older youth instead of by adults
- An opportunity for Cub Scouts to participate in quality outdoor pro-
- Cub Scouts can see themselves as future Arrowmen and be encouraged to continue in Scouting
- Cub Scouts can have fun with older boys closer to their age than the adult leaders

OA LODGE MEMBERBSHIP

DUES: If you took your Ordeal in September 2010, your dues are paid through December 31, 2011. We do this because there are typically few lodge activities from September to December. No matter when you take your Ordeal, you will receive a dues renewal card in the mail when it is time to renew your membership. Please use the reminder card when renewing. It speeds our processing greatly. If you do not pay your dues, you are not considered an active member of the lodge. Dues are \$12.00 if paid before December 31. Late payment fee or re-instatement fee (if you have not paid dues more than 2 years) is \$15.00. We ask that you pay your dues as quickly as possible after receiving your renewal card. Lodge dues to the National office come

due at the end of the year, and we need your payments to cover those fees. Also, after December 31, the membership committee is involved in processing new unit elections, so it gets busy for us if you didn't pay on time.

TRANSFERS IN/OUT OF THE LODGE: If

you are moving into or out of the area, and are changing your BSA registration to or from another council, you must change your lodge registration. You may not be registered as a Scout or Scouter in one council and as a lodge member in a different council. Contact the membership committee of the council you are leaving to obtain proof of your membership, and supply it to the membership committee of the council you are going to. Kittatinny has provided an incoming Lodge Transfer Form on our web site

for this purpose. By attaching your proof of prior membership, we can quickly get you registered in Kittatinny Lodge.

RECORD KEEPING AND REPORTING: If

you have a question about your membership status, dues payments, event registrations, etc, contact us at the phone numbers listed in OA Directory. You may also email your questions to membership@kittatinny5.org, or use our web message center and address your question to membership committee.

The Order of the Arrow Scouting's National History **Honor Society**

For more than 95 years, the Order of the Arrow (OA) has recognized

Scouts and Scouters who best exemplify the Scout Oath and Law in their daily lives. This recognition provides encouragement for others to live these ideals as well.

Arrowmen are known for maintaining camping traditions and spirit, promoting year-round and long-term resident camping, developing leaders, and providing cheerful service to others. OA service, activities, adventures, and training for youth and adults are models of quality leadership development and programming that enrich, support, and help to extend Scouting to America's youth.

The mission of the Order of the Arrow is to fulfill its purpose as an integral part of the Boy Scouts of America through positive youth leadership under the guidance of selected capable adults.

Purpose

As Scouting's National Honor Society, our purpose is to: Recognize those who best exemplify the Scout Oath and Law in their daily lives and through that recognition cause others to conduct themselves in a way that warrants similar recognition.

Promote camping, responsible outdoor adventure, and environmental stewardship as essential components of every Scout's experience, in the unit, year-round, and in summer camp.

Crystallize the Scout habit of helpfulness into a life purpose of leadership in cheerful service to others.

Develop leaders with the willingness, character, spirit and ability to advance the activities of their units, our Brotherhood, Scouting, and ultimately our nation.

The Order of the Arrow was founded by Dr. E. Urner Goodman and Carroll A. Edson in 1915 at the Treasure Island Camp of the Philadelphia Council, Boy Scouts of America. It became an official program experiment in 1922 and was approved as part of the Scouting program in 1934. In 1948 the OA, recognized as the BSA's national brotherhood of honor campers, became an official part of the Boy Scouts of America. In 1998, the Order of the Arrow became recognized as Scouting's National Honor Society when it expanded its reach beyond camping to include a greater focus on leadership development, membership extension, adventurous programming, and broader service to Scouting and the community. Today, its service, activities, adventures, and training for youth and adults, are models of quality leadership development and programming The induction process, called the Ordeal, is the that enrich, support, and help extend Scouting to America's youth.

Membership

The OA has over 171,000 members in lodges affiliated with more than 290 local BSA councils.

Eligibility

The Order of the Arrow membership requirements are:

- Be a registered member of the Boy Scouts of America.
- After registration with a troop or team, have experienced 15 days and nights of Boy Scout camping during the two-year Vigil Honor period prior to the election. The 15 days After two years of exceptional service as a Brothand nights must include one, but no more than one, long-term camp consisting of six consecutive days and five nights of resident camping, approved and under the auspices and standards of the Boy Scouts of America. The balance of the camping must be overnight, weekend, or other short-term camps.
- Youth must be under the age of 21, hold the BSA First Class rank or

- higher, and following approval by the Scoutmaster or Varsity team Coach, be elected by the youth members of their troop or team.
- Adults (age 21 or older) who are registered in the BSA and meet the camping requirements may be selected following nomination to the lodge adult selection committee. Adult selection is based on their ability to perform the necessary functions to help the Order fulfill its purpose, and is not for recognition of service, including current or prior positions. Selected adults must be an asset to the Order because of demonstrated abilities, and must provide a positive example for the growth and development of the youth members of the lodge.

Ordeal Membership

first step toward full membership in the Order. Upon completion of the Ordeal and its ceremony, the member is expected to strengthen his involvement in the unit and encourage Scout camping.

Brotherhood Membership

After 10 months of service as an Ordeal member and after fulfilling certain requirements, a member may take part in the Brotherhood ceremony, which places further emphasis on the ideals of Scouting and the Order. Completion of this ceremony signifies full membership in the Order of the Arrow.

erhood member, and with the approval of the national Order of the Arrow committee, a youth or adult Arrowman may be recognized with the Vigil Honor for their distinguished contributions to their lodge, the Order of the Arrow, Scouting, or their Scout camp. This honor is bestowed by special selection and is limited to one Arrowman for every 50 members registered with the lodge each year.



THE NEW RIVER EXPERIENCE

SummitCorps – the New River Experience service and adventure go together like peanut butter and jelly. Milk and cookies. Map and compass. At least that's the idea that the Order of the Arrow is exploring with SummitCorps The New River Experience in July of 2011 at the New River Gorge National River in West Virginia.

For years, the Order of the Arrow has pioneered the concept of the service adventure with the OA High Adventure Programs. In 2008, the OA had the chance to open up the service adventure to more Arrowmen with $ArrowCorps^5$. Now, in 2011, the Order of the Arrow is providing another opportunity to blend the bliss that comes from cheerful service and the personal growth that can only come from a high adventure. While the service to the national river is an important aspect of the project, the fun that comes from recreation, brotherhood, and being in the wilderness will make the experience that much richer.

Many Arrowmen have experienced service, and have experienced adventure. If you have not taken the time to experience one of the Order's service adventure opportunities, 2011 is your chance. Join us for the service adventure of a lifetime in West Virginia.
