With the prospects of 2021 being better than 2020, we have two Ordeal/Service weekends coming up in the very near future, April 16-17 and May 14-15. For the Spring, we will continue with the 2-day OA weekend format we used successfully in September 2020.

Candidates only will report to camp on Friday night like they normally would, and hold the Pre-Ordeal ceremony and camp overnight. Saturday morning, all regular members will arrive bright and early for a light breakfast and have cheerful service assignments made, as we break into small-sized, fixed cohort groups to meet Covid restrictions. This seemed to work

out quite well in September, and because there are small group sizes, you get to know others a little bit better.

If you are taking your Brotherhood, you will be in your own cohort group so you can spend the day with others talking about and learning about the OA so you can successfully complete your Brotherhood Review before your Brotherhood Ceremony.

At the end of the work day, there will be a bit of down time, some light dinner, and moving into the ceremonies. All participants depart early Saturday evening. We are going to list September weekend as a full three-day weekend, with the understanding that if Covid doesn't release it's chokehold on activities, we'll fall back to the 2-day format in September.

Conclave 2021

Conclave 2021 is a gathering of all the lodges in our section for a weekend of fun, food, learning, competition, and fellowship.

It's one of the best OA activities you can participate in. There are shows, training activities and athletic activities to participate in.

This year, Lodge 317 (Guneukitschik Lodge, Mason-Dixon Council) will be the host lodge and we'll travel to Camp Sinoquipe in Fort Littleton, PA. The theme this year will be "Olympic Adventure" themed around the Olympic games. On the proposed activities list is: swimming relays, boating relays, volleyball, horseshoes, cornhole, competitive shooting (rifle, shotgun, and archery), ultimate frisbee, kickball, basketball, gaga ball, life size games, minefield game, running/race activity and tug of war.

Kittatinny will be allocated, 26 spots to attend, and new this year will be a BYOT (bring your own tent) format, due to their camp's Covid policies and restrictions. The cost for Conclave will be \$45.00 and participants must work out their own transportation to get to/from the event, which is about a 2-hour drive from camp. Signup will be available online and will be announced through email, website, and social media. You don't want to miss this!

NOAC is Back in 2022

National Order of the Arrow Conference to be held at UT, Knoxville

Covid put a major damper on the planned 2020 NOAC trip the lodge was planning to attend at Michigan State University last year, but the national OA leadership will be bringing it back in 2022, as Arrowmen from across the country (and the world) will descend on the University of Tennessee, Knoxville on July 25-30, 2022.

For those who have not experienced NOAC, it's like the National Jamboree for Arrowmen. We'll live in the university dorms, eat in their cafeterias, use all of their buildings and many of their sports facilities for training, activities, amazing arena shows, and displays. Rumor has it some patch trading takes place there too. It's a great way to meet Arrowment from near and far in the spirit of the "Brotherhood of Cheerful Service".

The lodge typically takes a motor coach, and the expected cost is around \$545 for youth to attend. Adults pay an additional amount for transportation. Our lodge patch auctions help offset the transportation costs for youth members so they are paying for the event only. And speaking of the patch auctions, the LEC also approved a new NOAC fund-raiser double pocket-flap set in February. Look for it coming out later this year.

NOAC online registration will open in October, but start planning and saving now, as you will not want to miss it !!!

New Online Tools of Arrowmen

The national office of the Order of the Arrow is releasing new tools to help lodges and Arrowmen reduce costs and communicate better, and to level the playing field for lodges that may not have the resources to do it all themselves.

The tools include the addition of an Induction Module in OA LodgeMaster (the web-program we use to keep track of our lodge), and a new Member Portal, where members will be able to go for a listing of upcoming events, links to register, the ability to self-update information like phone numbers, addresses and email.

The Portal will first be available to new Arrowmen as part of the Induction module. Later this year, it will be available to all lodge Arrowmen. The times are changing, but the OA is keeping up with technology.

This isn't your grandfather's OA! We'll let you know as soon as things become available.

* The reality is that over the last 5 years, our lodge membership has fallen drastically. In 2020, we ended the year with 410 dues-paid members. In 2015, we had 987. You can see our concern, as that is close to 100 members lost each year. There are likely many reasons for some of this: changes to the BSA, decreased membership in units, etc. Despite this, we still want to provide the OA opportunities of leadership development, specialty high adventure, and some of the best training and activity opportunities Scouts can receive.

100th Anniversary Award Approved

Hello Brothers.

The Lodge Executive Committee approved a Lodge 5 Centennial Award for 2021. To build upon the purpose of the Order, many of the requirements involve some form of service. Similar to the Lodge Participation Award,

to earn the Centennial Award, members will need to complete a number of requirements from different categories. In addition to participating in some key service projects, there are camping participation options, as well as attending special 100th activities like the birthday party (July 1), or the Anniversary fun-day in

September. There are a number of creative options too, such as submitting entries for a scout camping photo contest², submitting an art project², and designing a patch or neckerchief. You will also need to participate in

some of the lodge activities throughout the year. You'll want to be active in this very special year in the lodge's history. Don't miss out on this once-in-a-lifetime award.




July 1, 2021 will mark the 100th anniversary of Lodge 5 in the Order of the Arrow.

The "5" was the original numbering of lodges as they began to be instituted in councils, so we are the 5th oldest lodge in the country.

The founder of the Order of the Arrow, E. Urner Goodman, came to Berks County to install the lodge at Camp Indiandale, near Vinemont, and we were, for a short time, Indiandale Lodge, and the original totem was a bison. For unknown reasons, the lodge totem was changed shortly thereafter (3-1/2 month on October 25) to the timber wolf, and the name to Minsi Lodge (it is speculated the change was because it aligned better with this geographic area). When Minsi Lodge 5 merged with Memeu Lodge 125 due to the merger of Appalachian Trails Council with Daniel Boone Council in 1971, the lodge retained the number 5 as well as the wolf totem, as

was the custom of the day, using the lowest number when lodges merged.
