Lodge History

A Bolo of a Different Color by Kyle Dierolf

You may have noticed that members of Kittatinny Lodge Order of the Arrow. These bolos are presented at the wear bolo ties with their field uniforms of varying colors. Some of these are awards and some represent present and past leadership positions in the lodge. No matter the meaning, recipients often wear their bolos to show their lodge spirit at scouting functions. You may have also wondered what all the different colors mean and how these came to be. All bolos are adorned with a metal Kittatinny wolf head. Modern renditions have the typical Kittatinny wolf with green eyes backed by a red arrow going up and to the right. Older bolos display the wolf head commonly associated with the Minsi Lodge wolf with yellow eyes and the arrow going up and to the left. Let's explore the different bolos...

Black: These are available in Kitty Inc for any and all lodge members to wear! This is a great way to show your lodge spirit throughout the scouting community. In 2011 when ordering new metal heads for the award bolos the lodge received a shipment of the heads with black bolo cord already in place. It was then decided to sell them in Kitty Inc to the lodge membership. Since then the black lodge bolos have become rather popular with our lodge's Arrowmen. These display the metal Kittatinny wolf head on black cord.

Yellow: These represent the Chief's Award. The Chief's award is presented by the lodge chief annually to youth members who display exemplary enthusiasm towards the lodge and display a high level of dedication and leadership to the lodge's operations no matter their position or level. This award was first presented in 2009 at the lodge banquet following its creation by the 2008-2009 lodge officers; Kyle Dierolf (Lodge Chief), Phil Thomas (Vice Chief of Administration), Dan Kline (Vice Chief of Program), Josh Seidel (Secretary), and Brian Kahl (Treasurer) as a way to recognize youth members of the lodge. Yellow was chosen as one of the lodge's official colors that was not currently in use. The first two years this award was presented the bolo featured a hand carved arrowhead with the lodge's hat pin embedded in them made by former Lodge Adviser (and former Minsi Lodge Chief) Joe Pietruszynski. The Chief's Award has since displayed the metal Kittatinny wolf head on vellow cord.

Red & White: The Lodge Chief's bolo is displayed on red and white bolo cord representing the colors of the

beginning of a chief's term and are meant to be worn for the remainder of their scouting career. The Lodge Chief's bolo was created and presented as an outward recognition to our lodge's youth leader for their service, dedication, and hard work that comes with the role of chief. Current and future lodge leaders may look to these individuals for advice and guidance to learn from their experiences. This bolo was first presented by then Lodge Advisor Kyle Dierolf to then Lodge Chief Tony Stianche at a Lodge Thirdly Meeting on April 23, 2017. Future chiefs have since been presented with the red and white bolo in addition to former chiefs who have been to lodge functions since its inception. The creation of this bolo began in 2015 with discussions among Lodge Adviser Rudy Benkert, Assoc. Lodge Adviser Kyle Dierolf, and Lodge Chief Austin Noguera. This bolo displays the metal Kittatinny wolf head on red and white cord.

Red: The Adviser's award. These awards are typically presented at the end of a Lodge Adviser's term to adult committee advisers and adult members for outstanding service to the lodge and its mission. Recipients serve the lodge selflessly while guiding the youth leaders of our lodge. These were first presented in 1991 by Lodge Adviser Joe Pietruszynski. The Adviser's Award currently displays the metal Kittatinny wolf head on red cord.

White: The white bolos are worn by the current and former Lodge Advisers of the lodge. This tradition first started in 1984 with a beaded necklace that was passed onto the next lodge adviser until 1998 when the bolos were put into use. The beaded necklaces are on display in the Kittatinny Room at HMSR. These bolos are presented to an incoming Lodge Adviser at the start of their term and may be worn throughout their scouting career as recognition of their service to the youth members of the lodge. The Lodge Adviser's bolo displays the metal Kittatinny wolf head on white bolo cord.

Five bolos colors for Kittatinny 5! Our lodge is rich in history so hopefully this provides some information for something that is so visible amongst our members. If you see anyone wearing these bolos please ask them about their experiences in the lodge and be prepared to listen to some fun stories and pieces of advice.

Although many attempts since have been made to release a new issue, many of which were during my time a Communications Chairman we finally were




able to get it done. I want to thank every Committee and Lodge Member who helped by submitting ideas or articles.
